This collective effort continues to illuminate how essential our work is in creating accessible and inclusive towns. Thank you for making these meaningful strides possible; we look forward to continuing this vital journey with you.



Highlights of 2025

This year TWB...

- Expanded our neurodiversity and disability inclusion workshops, delivering our affirming message to hundreds of people including: employees of PTC Therapeutics, LLC, and Hachette Book Group, dozens of YMCA camp counselors, 60+ caregivers and parents, and dozens of teachers.
- Completed 18 interactive school assemblies for students across 3 elementary schools in SOMA on neurodiversity, disability, differences, and perspective taking.
- Expanded our team of facilitators and launched our Advisory Board, ensuring that 100% of our workshops/assemblies feature disabled presenters and 86% of our leadership has lived experience of disability.
- Launched our Community Access Program with our "Traveling Sensory Room" available for loan to the community, making quality sensory access tools more accessible to the community at 9 community events in the first 9 months.
- Provided over \$2,000 of sliding scale scholarships for neurodiversity-affirming language therapy for kids with disabilities.
- Designed and implemented accessibility & inclusivity initiatives at Maplewoodstock music festival for the second year, attended by 10,000+ people.
- **Hosted the second annual Neuroqueer Pride** area at the North Jersey Pride festival with over 200 people utilizing the sensory-inclusive spaces.
- Initiated the SOMA Neurodiversity Community Network with the neurodiversity-affirming booklists community resource in partnership with Maplewood Library
- Expanded our technical assistance and accessibility consultations to support local organizations to be more accessible through permanent and event-based accommodations.
- Was featured by dozens of news sources, including The Associated Press highlighting our permanent sensory room installed at St. Joseph's Church in 2024

- Grow the new SOMA Neurodiversity Community Network for vital community building and advocacy organizing
- Launch our "Blueprints of Belonging" initiative to provide free and low-cost accessibility tools and education to the community making our towns more inclusive and equitable.
- Expand our advocacy for disabled student's education rights in the public schools in partnership with SOMA Peer Support + Action Network for IEP
- Expand neurodiversity and anti-ableist education across the community including more school-based assemblies for kids, parent workshops, teacher trainings, and business consultations.
- Expand access to speech-language therapy with ongoing sliding scale scholarships
